## **ORDINATION OF DEACONS**

### **LAYING ON OF HANDS AND PRAYER OF ORDINATION TO THE DIACONATE**

*Through the laying on of hands by the Bishop and the Prayer of Ordination, the gift of the Holy Spirit for the office of deacon is conferred on the candidate.*

*The following words belong to the nature of the rite and are consequently required for the validity of the act:*

*“Send forth upon him, Lord, we pray the Holy Spirit, that he may be strengthened by the gift of your sevenfold grace for the faithful carrying out of the work of the ministry.”*

### **VESTING WITH THE STOLE AND DALMATIC**

*Immediately after the Prayer of Ordination, the newly ordained Deacon is invested with the diaconal stole and dalmatic. By this investiture the liturgical ministry that he will henceforth fulfill is outwardly manifested.*

### **HANDING ON OF THE BOOK OF THE GOSPELS**

*The handing on of the Book of Gospels signifies the office of the deacon to proclaim the Gospel in liturgical celebrations and to preach the faith of the Church in word and deed.*

### **FRATERNAL KISS**

*The Bishop and representatives from the Deacons offer a fraternal kiss of peace to the newly ordained as a sign of welcome into the Order of Deacons.*
