What is Catechesis?

Catechesis is the act of handing on the Word of God

cat·e·che·sis kadə kēsəs -Greek

To inform the faith community and candidates for initiation into the Church about the teachings of Christ, transmitted by the Apostles to the Church. USCCB

Catechesis is a life-long process of initial conversion, formation, education, and on-going conversion

The Catechetical Process


"A Catechist is a person who facilitates the process of faith formation. This is done first by echoing the word of God in his or her own life, and second by helping others to do so...Through your work with adults, families, adolescents, and children, you are passing on a lived faith."

- Engaging: The life experience of the participants
- Exploring: The Concepts to be Taught (Scripture and Tradition)
- **Reflecting:** Integrating Concepts with Lived Experience
- **Responding:** with a New Way of Living

- Patience, responsibility, creativity
















6 tasks of Catechesis

- 2. Promoting liturgy and the sacraments.
- 3. Encouraging moral formation in Jesus Christ.
- 4. Teaching and promoting prayer.
- 5. Strengthening the faith community and the Church.
- 6. Participating in the Christian Mission to the world and society.

- Ongoing commitment to training






Not Your Job Alone
