Philosophy

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS PROMOTE AND PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL MESSAGE IN THE CONTEXT OF THE TRADITION AND OFFICIAL TEACHINGS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

- by proclaiming the Gospel and supporting the mission of the Church, bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ, His Person and His teachings in the form of evangelization, catechesis and example;
- by continuing to preserve the Catholic Identity, embracing its traditions, faith, ideals, practices, and family values through Liturgy, Scripture, Tradition, in a way that is both instructional and experiential and in unity with the magisterium of the Church;

- by promoting the Gospel values in a Christ-centered environment, building community, showing respect, reverence and responsibility motivating each one to service and by entering into prayer and worship;
- by administrative and staff selection that exhibits a concern that each person model and contribute to a faith commitment and experience.

- by forming the whole child in mind, body and spirit, while recognizing the dignity, uniqueness, and gifts of each child and by developing the gifts of each child to full potential

- by providing a program that is holistic in its approach to growth and development, cognizant of developmental stages and learning styles;
- by generating programs that reflect the diversity of ability and needs to enable learning for all students;
- by enabling students to become critical thinkers, problem solvers and decision makers in order to assume leadership, and to live as responsible and informed citizens in the 21st century;
- by a teaching/learning process that will be accomplished with current textbooks and curriculum materials supported by appropriate technology and resources when available;
- by implementing the curriculum through highly qualified and trained personnel supported by a structured program of in-service and updating in content and methodology.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS ARE ROOTED IN THE HUMANITIES AND SCIENCES AND IDENTIFY THE UNIQUENESS OF THEIR STUDENTS

- by reverencing the dignity and oneness of all peoples of the earth, respecting the spiritualities, traditions, and languages unique to each;
- by creating growth and nourishing the spirit through awareness of and involvement in the fine and creative arts;
- by emphasizing the importance of cooperation and interdependence addressing the moral implications for the economy, ecology, culture, technology and governments;
- by providing a curriculum which will present a positive image of all people, regardless of race, creed, sex, or disabling conditions;
- by teaching and modeling non-violence in the school environment;
- by educating for peace, justice, self-giving and brotherhood and
- by focusing on needs of the poor; by remaining sensitive to persons with disabilities.

- by providing an integrated program and environment, building selfesteem and fostering mutual appreciation and respect supporting one another in dealing with real life issues and problems;
- by nurturing our students in an environment in which they are surrounded by love, laughter, security, and acceptance;
- by recognizing the primacy of the family as educator and by instituting programs to support the family in its role;
- by establishing a school environment that is welcoming to parents and incorporates them into the educational process;

- by utilizing the school and its resources as a center for family education and life-long learning opportunities;
- by responding creatively to the needs of family life by implementing supportive evangelization programs and services within the parish and school setting.
